



Recommended changes and/or additions to Chapter 6, Article III of the Stephens City Town
Code to support functions of the Office of the Fire Marshal

Sec. 6.62 Definitions-

#### Modification of (a)-

Wherever in the Virginia Statewide Fire Prevention Code or elsewhere in the Town code the term "chief of the fire department" or "fire chief" appears it shall be construed to mean the chief of the fire department of this Town, or such other person who may be exercising any of the powers and performing any of the duties of the chief of the fire department pursuant to an agreement entered into under the provisions of Section 6-16, or both such persons, as the case may be.

Note- There is no section 6-16 to be found in the Town code. Unsure what it was referencing.

#### Addition of (c)-

Wherever in the Town code the term "fire prevention code", "statewide fire prevention code", or "VSFPC" appears it shall be construed to mean the Virginia Statewide Fire Prevention Code together with the applicable fire prevention codes established in this chapter.

Sec. 6.63 Permits, inspections, fees

#### Modification of (a)-

The town council may establish and from time to time amend a schedule of fees to be paid for permits, certificates, and inspection required by the Statewide Fire Prevention Code. Any schedule so established shall be maintained on file in the office of the Town clerk and a true copy thereof shall also be maintained on file in the office of the Fire Marshal and the Town treasurer. When any such scheduled has been so adopted, the fees therein provided shall be payable to the town treasurer prior to the issuance of the applicable permits and certificates or making the applicable inspections.

Note- References below this section to VA state code 15.1-14 and 15.1-15 are unable to be found in the online VA code. Possible the information has changed code sections.

#### Sec. 6-64 Modifications

Recommend removing this section from town code completely as modifications that are allowed to specific code items are specifically addressed in the Virginia Statewide Fire Prevention code VSFPC Sec 106.5.

#### Sec 6-65 Appeals

#### Modification

Appeals concerning the administration, enforcement, interpretation, and/or application of this chapter by the Fire Marshal or Assistant Fire Marshal(s) shall follow procedures outlined in the VSFPC. Appeals from the application of the VSFPC by the State Fire Marshal shall be made directly to the State Building Code Technical Review Board as provided in § 36-108 et seq. of the Code of Virginia (1950, as amended), and as may be subsequently amended.

#### REQUIRED CHANGE TO CHAPTER 6, ARTICLE IV TO ESTABLISH TOWN FIRE MARSHAL OFFICE:

#### Section 6-88

Modification to section (c)-

There is hereby established for the Town the Office of the Fire Marshal. "Fire Marshal" shall be defined as a sworn law enforcement official responsible for investigating the causes of fires and explosions, enforcing fire-prevention laws set forth in this code and the Virginia Statewide Fire Prevention Code, life-safety inspections, and fire education to the public. The Fire Marshal shall serve as the 'fire code official' for the Town. "Assistant Fire Marshal" shall be defined as a sworn law enforcement officer to serve as the Fire Marshal's designated representative. The Office of the Fire Marshal shall consist of the Town Fire Marshal and a number of Assistant Fire Marshals as deemed appropriate by the Fire Marshal and Town Council. The Fire Marshal and Assistant Fire Marshal(s) shall be appointed by the Town Council. The Fire Marshal and Assistant Fire Marshal(s) for the Town shall have all of the powers, duties, and responsibilities as provided for under the Code for the Commonwealth of Virginia, as amended by the General Assembly from time to time, including those powers set forth in Chapter 3, of Title 27 of the Code of Virginia. The investigation into the origin and cause of every fire and explosion occurring within the limits for which he/she is appointed, investigation and prosecution of all offenses involving hazardous materials, fires, fire bombings, bombings, attempts or threats to commit such offenses, false alarms relating to such offenses, possession and manufacture of explosive devices, substances, and fire bombs, and environmental crimes shall be the responsibility of the Fire Marshal, his/her designated representative, the Assistant Fire Marshal(s), and legal counsel. The requirements in Chapter 6 of this code shall be administered and enforced by the Office of the Fire Marshal as referred to as the "Authority Having Jurisdiction." Subject to the provisions of Section 6-65 of this code, the Fire Marshal or Assistant Fire Marshal(s) shall interpret this Chapter and the provisions of the VSFPC, where necessary and that interpretation shall be binding and final. This section shall apply to all matters affecting or relating to structures, processes and premises as set forth in Sections 101 and 102 of the VSFPC.
