THE NEWTOWN HERITAGE FESTIVAL THAT WASN'T

The dedicated volunteers on our Newtown Heritage Festival Committee began working on the 2020 festival after last year's Festival. By January 2020, the entertainment had bees scheduled, crafter and food vendor applications were coming in, fireworks were lined up and our wonderful donors were responding with their support. We even had a theme with events celebrating the entrepreneurial spirit of our town, highlighting two businesses who have milestone anniversaries this year: Commercial Press, celebrating 50 years and Clem's Garage, celebrating 75 years, both under continual family ownership. Even the commemorative pottery piece had been commissioned. In March, COVID-19 hit and we had to cancel all plans for the health and safety of our community.

After some creative discussion, we decided to order a limited number of the Greenville Pottery commemoratives for the "Festival That Wasn't". 50 unique and hand thrown pieces were ordered. There is no date on the commemorative, but the year they were made is imprinted on the bottom by the potter. **These are limited edition commemoratives and no more will be made.** They are available at the town office at \$25.00 each.
